#### Faith-in-Action: Care Kits for Blanchet House

Join the Eighth graders in supporting the Blanchet House this Christmas season. The Blanchet House is a non-profit social services organization located in downtown Portland that provides food, clothing, and housing programs to people in need.

The **Eighth graders will be making Care Kits** for those in need and they need your help! Care Kits are designed to contain a few essential items that can greatly help someone without shelter during the different seasons.

We ask that <u>each student</u> bring in the item as stated below:

- Pre-Kindergarten 1x three pack of large adult socks
- Kindergarten Sack Project
- 1st grade 3 bars of individually wrapped regular sized soaps
- 2nd grade 2 boxes of granola bars
- 3rd grade 3 travel size lotions each
- 4th grade 3 packs of travel size wet wipes (approx. 30 count per pkg)
- 5th grade 2 travel size 30 count cotton swabs
- 6th grade 3 lips balms each
- 7th grade 1 box of medium or large band aids
- 8th grade 2 rain poncho's each

#### Donations can be delivered to the classrooms November 28 - December 7th.

Care Kits will be assembled on Wednesday, December 14 and delivered to Blanchet House.
