Uniform Expectations & New Communication Process

Beginning December 1, we implemented a new home/school communication process for students that are out of uniform in all grades.

Our new home/school uniform expectation communication will be as follows:

- Classes will receive a token each morning when the whole class is in uniform. (The intent behind giving tokens is to reward respectful, responsible and safe behavior as an entire class.)
- If a student has a uniform infraction, a purple half sheet of paper will come home explaining the uniform infraction and will require a parent signature.
- After the first infraction, depending on the age, the consequences will vary and be age appropriate. Examples include parent communication, phone calls home, missed recess, students sent to the office to borrow an item for the day (longer skirt, belt), etc.

We are asking parents for help in ensuring that all students are abiding by the uniform guidelines. Teachers should not have to take time from instruction to enforce uniform expectations. We ask parents to take an active role in enforcing proper uniform expectations at home prior to arriving at school.



Christmas Concert

Please join us on Wednesday, December 14 at 7pm for the return of our annual Christmas concert at St. Mary's Cathedral! This beloved tradition features a performance from each class (Pre-Kindergarten through Eighth grade) as well as the Cathedral School choir. Students have been working incredibly hard for the past two months and are excited to share their music with you and the entire Cathedral School community.



Your child will meet their classroom teacher in the church by 6:40pm. Students will sit as a class during the performance and be released to parents at the conclusion of the show. The student attire for this event is semi-formal – meaning holiday dresses, slacks, dress shirts and neatly combed hair. Please no jeans. Skirt lengths must adhere to the normal Cathedral School expectations.
